ARTEMIS-A- how will it work?



Schools provide parents information about the ARTEMIS-A app via email alongside an electronic link to opt-out of our research.



Parents who do not want their child to participate click the link and complete the form to opt-out of using ARTEMIS-A.



Researchers at the Universities of Cambridge and Manchester identify parents who have opted out and notify participating schools.



Schools email students who have permission to take part via the ARTEMIS-A portal.



Students who are happy to take part in our research using the ARTEMIS-A app click the link on a computer, tablet, laptop or phone and complete the assent form.



Students spend less than 10 minutes answering some questions about how they've been feeling lately. This produces an instant feedback report about their mental health.



If they are in need of support, students are signposted to a number of external resources (eg MIND) via the app. Selected pastoral staff members will also be able to access students' results via the ARTEMIS-A portal.



Named members of the ARTEMIS-A research team at the University of Manchester and University of Cambridge can access an anonymous version of students' results. No individual students can be identified in this version of the data.
