Parent Governor Vacancies (2)

The Governing Body is responsible for both the conduct of the school and for promoting high standards. The Governing Body carries out its role by setting the vision for the school and then ensuring that the school works efficiently and effectively towards achieving its vision. It does this by building a thorough knowledge of the school and its community, by both supporting and constructively challenging the school, and by ensuring accountability and compliance. The Governing Body of our school is made up of Parent Governors, Staff Governors and Co-opted Governors.

Two vacancies have arisen for Parent Governors on our Governing Body (one to commence in the Summer Term and one in the new academic year - Autumn). The Governing Body is asking you to nominate someone with parental responsibility for a child at the school. If more than two nominations are received, then a ballot will be held.

Before you decide to nominate someone, or indeed stand yourself, you may want to know a bit more about what is involved. Governors need not be experts in the field of education. What they do need is an interest in the school and in the welfare of our children and the time and willingness to get involved. The skills you have can be very useful to the Governing Body. Governors need what is known as 'soft skills' – the ability to be able to build relationships with a range of people, to be able to work as part of a team, to be able to question, and to make connections between different types of information. All Governors are expected to be able to read straightforward budget reports and data on school standards.

Our governing body expects Governors to:

- attend three termly meetings of the Full Governing Body
- sit on either the Leadership Management and Environment / Student Development and Welfare / Teaching Learning Assessment committees and attend the meetings which are usually once a term
- visit the school formally for monitoring purposes at least three times a year (dependant which committee you are on)
- visit the school informally to attend/support events/performances
- commit to attend training courses, perform additional research as required

- evidence of the extent to which you possess the skills and experience the Governing Body desires;
- your commitment to undertake training to acquire or develop the skills to be an effective Governor;
- if seeking re-election, details of your contribution to the work of the Governing Body during their previous term of office; and
- how you plan to contribute to the future work of the Governing Body.

If it is necessary for there to be an election, I will contact you to let you know about the arrangements.

If there are more nominations than vacancies, an election will be held on **Monday 13th February, 2023** and you will be sent a voting paper. You may return the ballot paper either via your child or by post.
