New Curriculum

In September 2022, we launched our new 5-year curriculum, which focusses on the essential knowledge and skills that your child will learn and develop. Careers and work-related learning are now explicitly taught alongside and in relation to our core curriculum. We have introduced new option subjects for our current Year 10 students, with subjects such as Psychology and Electrical Engineering, and we hope to continue to develop this offer over the next few years.
